#### **OVERVIEW**

#### **GENERAL FUND CASH BALANCE**

As of January 31, 2024, the General Fund cash balance has ending net operating cash of \$1.864 billion. This is the result of a \$3.039 billion beginning cash balance on July 1, 2023, a \$765.4 million operating cash deficit for FY 2024 and an allocation of \$410.1 million to the Budget Stabilization Fund.

There is no outstanding short-term general obligation debt for the fiscal year 2024.

As required by the Constitution of the State of Delaware, Article VIII, § 6. (d), \$328.8 million was dedicated to the Budget Reserve Account of the General Fund.

The combined General Fund/Special Fund Cash Balance is \$6.594 billion. Of this amount, \$543.1 million was received from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARP) and is included in the Special Fund Cash Balance. Unaudited ARP expenditures through January 31, 2024, are \$444.1 million recorded in the Special Fund. Of the \$444.1 million, \$38.6 million represents a temporary interfund borrowing.

Effective July 1, 2023, pursuant to 84 Del. Law, c. 81 (HB 195, §65), \$410.1 million was allocated to the Budget Stabilization Fund, a special fund holding account that would require an act of the General Assembly to enable appropriation and spending authority. As required by Executive Order 21 approved on June 30, 2018, §1(d), the Budget Stabilization Fund is increased by \$195.4 million, for reporting and planning purposes only.
